**Merry Christmas!!!** And here at the ranch it's a white Christmas, too! Beautiful and COLD! I spent the better part of one afternoon reviewing the year at the ranch. How many visitors, kids, sessions. It is always so encouraging for us to see the participants at our volunteer day each year, but also in the number of visitors who call to say "can we come see your place?" We always love the excuse to show the place off to people, but we also hope that we share it with a great sense of humility, because we know we would not be here without the grace of God and His wisdom and guidance. Looking back on our summer program we wanted to share a few statistics with you because it means so much to us when people participate in our program and throughout the year. We held 29 summertime sessions, with 13 kids, 4 weekend sessions with 7 kids, and had a grand total of 46 visitors (including 13 who helped assemble our arena on our 3rd Annual Volunteer Day) and used 3 horses and a burro as part of the program. We had enough donations to not only cover the cost of hay and grains, but also to rebuild a run-in shed, pay veterinarian and farrier bills, send Gracie to training, and cover the costs incurred with the loss of Shana. We feel blessed beyond measure because of the loving kindness of new and old friends and family. Thank you for your prayers, labor, financial gifts, and participation. We look forward to see what God has planned for 2016!
